The Idaho Juvenile Justice Commission (IJJC) is a State Advisory Group responsible for performing duties required by the federal Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act pertaining to the detention, arrest, and status of youth in the justice system. All members are appointed by the Governor.

The Youth Committee works in partnership with the IJJC in order to help facilitate change and improve Idaho's juvenile justice system.
