Thank you to all the support staff that worked so hard on this.</p> <p>There were two applications submitted for this grant. 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		<p>She Shelly, Idaho application fell short of the criteria that was set forth in the announcement. We do support this but the funding will need to be made another way than this grant. District 7 JJ Council or the Region 7 Behavioral Health Board may be able to help them with some funding.</p> <p>The IJJA conference happens every year in Idaho. This conference is for Juvenile Justice and Misdemeanor Probation. They applied for the full amount of the grant which was \$20,000.00. They had a very strong application. The vote was to recommend the application. We are recommending that they submit a budget and the money gets used for speakers and speaker fees.</p> <p>Motion: Sam Moore motion to approve the grant for the IJJA Board. 12.	IDJC Update	<p>Monty discussed the Legislative Session. We helped with the budget to get the Assessment Centers started. The one in Idaho Falls will have their ribbon cutting on Monday.</p> <p>IDJC's Lewiston Facility has partnered with Health and Welfare to update the Lewiston facility to help give some bed space for Health and Welfare.</p> <p>IDJC's Case Management IJOS system is getting a new system to a 2.0.</p> <p>The EPIC project has been going really well. The planning and compliance team are working with the DL's to visit all the centers. We got a bid for some videos to show what the four Core requirements are.
