WHAT WE DO

Each council develops a triennial Action Plan to assess risks, needs, and resources in their community based on the Balanced Approach framework. Due to unique political, historic, economic and social characteristics of each local community, each community is best suited to prioritize their needs.



HOW WE MAKE AN IMPACT

District Council members create impact by bringing diverse voices together into meaningful discussions. Through collaboration, they identify local needs, share resources, and shape solutions. The Idaho district structure ensures that every region, from the panhandle to the southern borders, has a voice in juvenile justice, allowing councils to prioritize issues unique to their communities while contributing to statewide change.

TRIBAL COUNCIL

The Idaho Juvenile Justice Tribal Council advises the Idaho Juvenile Justice Commission on issues affecting Native American youth in the justice system. It advocates for Tribal youth, and helps shape related policies and programs.

The council includes two representatives each from six Tribes: Coeur d'Alene, Kootenai, Nez Perce, Northwest Band of Shoshone Nation, Shoshone-Bannock, and Shoshone-Paiute.
